

## NCBC Articulation Agreement - LIFE School

Northern California Bible College has assessed the transferability of LIFE School's core curriculum. Students should request a LIFE School transcript with a list of courses. These units are unaccredited.

LIFE School runs on a 10-week quarter system with 4 quarters per year. The school has 8-10 hours of lecture, reading, writing, and homework per week.

**Year 1** - Receive training and activation in identity, physical healing, emotional healing, deliverance, prophecy, and the Father's love. Learn to live a Kingdom lifestyle that integrates these as part of everyday life.

**Year 2** - Teaching and activation in creating and establishing an apostolic culture, inquiry-based discipleship, and building high-performance, influential Kingdom teams that run as a family on the mission of Jesus.

### Summary of LIFE School Curricular Requirements

- Undergraduate Level Transfer
  - Other TRACS institutions are assessing the 2-year program of LIFE school as 45 quarter units of transfer. (Other institutions break down 20 quarter units for year 1 and 25 quarter units for year 2)
  - 8-10 hours per week of lecture and homework is 6 units per quarter.
  - NCBC assesses **Year 1** = 4 quarters \* 6 units = **24 units**
  - NCBC assesses **Year 2** = 4 quarters \* 6 units = **24 units**
  - NCBC has a 135 quarter unit limit to transfer units
- Graduate Level Transfer
  - Other TRACS institutions are assessing the 2 year program of LIFE school as 9 quarter units of transfer. (FIU Agreement "At the MA level, students can receive "Advanced Standing" in their pursuit of a graduate degree where it will be 15 classes instead of 18.")
  - NCBC assesses **Year 1** = 4 quarters \* 3 graduate units = 12 units
  - NCBC assesses **Year 2** = 4 quarters \* 3 graduate units = 12 units
  - However, NCBC (like FIU) has a **9 unit** transfer limit for graduate units

The LIFE School offers courses in Biblical Studies, leadership, and ministry that are compatible with the educational standards of NCBC.

- Standard residency unit requirements at NCBC still exist. All LIFE School units are treated as lower division level transfer (or graduate-level transfer).

Please Note: The units can be used toward a degree at NCBC. These units will not turn into NCBC units for transfer anywhere else. They will be used for internal accounting toward an NCBC degree, but will not be written into the NCBC transcript if a student transfers before completing their degree.
