## NCBC Articulation Agreement - VETI

Northern California Bible College has assessed the transferability of Victory Outreach Bible College and Victory Education & Training Institute (VETI) core curriculum.

## Summary of VETI Curricular Requirements

- VETI offers an unaccredited AA degree
  - o <u>Classes</u> are on 8 week quarters and meet 3 hours per week (24 hours per quarter for 3 units)
    - Summer classes only meet for 15 hours (SHOULD BE WORTH LESS UNITS)
    - Some 1 unit classes are taught for 8 hours
  - o 2 years 3 courses of 3 quarter units over 4 quarters per year (12 classes per year)
  - A total of 36+36= 72 quarter units (24 classes for an AA)
  - ACCREDITED INSTITUTIONS REQUIRE 90 QUARTER UNITS FOR AN AA EQUIVALENCY
- VETI offers an unaccredited <u>BA degree</u>
  - This 18-month, 42-quarter unit program consists of 6 Modules.
  - ACCREDITED INSTITUTION REQUIRE 180 QUARTER UNITS FOR A BA EQUIVALENCY

The VETI program offers courses in Biblical Studies, leadership, and ministry that are compatible with the educational standards of NCBC.

- Credits from VETI do transfer as quarter units per class
  - Standard residency unit requirements at NCBC still exist. All VETI units are treated as GE-level transfers.
- AA and BA degrees from VETI do not transfer because they may be below accreditation standards of 90 or 180 quarter units respectively.
  - AA degrees transfer as 72 quarter units (summer classes will receive a deduction of units)
  - o BA degrees transfer as 42 quarter units

The VETI BA is sufficient to be admitted to the NCBC Master's program if the student has completed a total of 180 quarter units of college-level work.

Please Note: The units can be used toward a degree at NCBC. These units will not turn into NCBC units for transfer anywhere else. They will be used for internal accounting toward an NCBC degree, but will not be written into the NCBC transcript if a student transfers before completing their degree.
